With the Transfer Center You Can Start Here, Go Anywhere

The Transfer Center can help make the transition from associate's degree studies at Cincinnati State to a bachelor's degree. Many degree programs at Cincinnati State serve as stepping stones to a four-year program. You can start here, earn an associate's degree, and then transfer those credits to a four-year institution to finish a bachelor's or other higher degree program. Students can meet with representatives from area colleges and universities, get information about transfer events, and learn more about articulation agreements with our partner institutions.

Enroll in one of our transfer programs such as Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Pre-Business Administration, Pre-Engineering, and Pre-Nutrition Science. These programs are designed with a bachelor's degree in mind, so you can easily transfer your credit to a four-year institution. These degrees feature directed electives that allow you to build towards a wide range of bachelor's degrees.

Cincinnati State also offers bachelor's degrees in Culinary & Food Science, Land Surveying, and a RN to BSN Completion program.

Business

As your community college, Cincinnati State offers specialized training programs to meet the employment needs of our region. Cincinnati needs people skilled in the areas of accounting, financial services, landscape and horticulture, marketing, management, office professionals,

and law and paralegal. Each business degree and certificate program is designed in collaboration with an advisory board of professionals from Greater Cincinnati's leading companies. Culinary

Our bachelor's degree in Culinary & Food Science will prepare you to analyze food and develop new products. Information Technology

Information technology is one of the fastest growing industries in the country. Get hands-on training for information and technology related careers, from computer hardware, computer support, and programming to network administration, cyber-security and management. Our faculty continue to work with our city's industry leaders and local businesses to prepare students for high-tech careers.

Education and Service

If you are interested in education and service fields, our Early Childhood Education program will prepare you for the Pre-Kindergarten Associate Teacher License offered by the Ohio Department of Education. The Interpreter Training program regularly interacts with members of the deaf community, while preparing graduates to serve as skilled sign language interpreters. The Human and Social Services program and certificates in Addiction Studies will introduce you to career possibilities related to social services and criminal justice.

Engineering

Technology has transformed the manufacturing industry, and today's job applicants need specialized education to meet emerging market demands. Cincinnati State's Engineering Technology programs have kept up with these needs. You can choose from such core disciplines as bioscience, chemical, civil, construction, electrical, mechanical engineering technologies, and welding. Public Safety

With our RN to BSN Completion Program and state-of-the-art Health Simulation laboratory, Cincinnati State has everything you need to get your nursing career on track.

Transportation

While the need for good auto technicians hasn't changed, the technical knowledge required to be one has. Our Kenwood Dealer Group School of Automotive Technology combines classroom training with hands-on lab work in and outside the classroom with our co-op program. Our degree and certificate programs give students the technical skills needed to earn professional certifications as well as important foundations in automotive service management.

We also prepare students for careers in Aircraft Maintenance with FAA-approved degree and certificate programs in Aviation Mechanics. Aviation-related programs are housed at our West Campus in Harrison.

Multimedia and Design

Our multimedia and design programs will prepare you to work in an exciting and growing field that combines creativity and technology, with degree and certificate programs such as Graphic Design and Web Development, or Audio and Video Production. WDC courses are offered at Cincinnati State's Workforce Development Center located in Evendale. Most of the WDC programs are offered in-person or online in an accelerated format to allow students to finish quickly and use their new skills in the workplace immediately.

As part of this effort, WDC also offers customized, hands-on training programs. SUPPORT ON YOUR JOURNEY

Going to college can be challenging. Whether you're attending college for the first time, or finishing a degree you started long ago, we are dedicated to providing student support services to help every student succeed.

Learning Centers

Cincinnati State's learning centers offer one-on-one and small group academic assistance, online, and in-person. Appointments and walk-in help are available for a variety of purposes:

- Enhance skills, understanding, and confidence for greater success in coursework
- Improve study skills, practice self-directed learning, and reduce test anxiety
- Support developing problem-solving skills

Tutoring Center

The Tutoring Center helps students build academic strength and confidence with individualized support in many subjects including accounting, computer skills, economics, science, and more at Clifton and Middletown campuses.

Writing Center

The Writing Center provides individualized support to students in any course that includes written assignments. Writing Center faculty are available for assistance with essays, lab reports, resumes, and cover letters. The Writing Center enables all students to achieve success by exploring ideas through writing.

Math Center

The Math Center provides one-on-one and group support to students from basic math to calculus. Math Center faculty assist students in building foundations for success in all math and math-based courses, including statistics, quantitative reasoning, physics, and chemistry. The Math Center prepares students for success by helping students develop strong problem-solving skills and confidence.

IT Help Desk

Support and assistance is available for college devices and technology at the Walk-Up Service Window, online, and by phone.

Counseling Services

Licensed and professionally-trained counselors are available to perform counseling and referral services to address needs and facilitate mental health care for Cincinnati State students. All services and meetings are kept confidential.

Disability Services

A variety of academic support services are available free of charge to qualified students with disabilities. These services include but are not limited to assistive technology and listening devices, extended time on tests, quiet environment for testing, physical assistance, and sign language interpreting.

International Student Affairs

International students residing both outside and inside the U.S. receive assistance navigating the process of applying to Cincinnati State, including guidance on visa issues, transcript translation, and cultural adjustment.

Veteran Student Affairs

Veterans, eligible dependents, and reservists with their benefit eligibility receive free counseling, claim filing, and referrals to other campus and community services. Veteran Student Affairs also monitors student degree plans.

Test Scores (optional)

Test scores are not required for admission to the college; however, they can be useful for advising purposes. Therefore, we encourage students who have taken the ACT or SAT within the past two years to request that their scores be included on their high school transcript or sent from the testing service. Our school code for the ACT is 5570 and SAT is 1984.

Advanced Standing and Prior Learning Assessment

There are several ways for applicants to obtain advanced academic standing in their program:

- Transferring course credits earned at another regionally accredited college or university.
- Submitting scores from Advanced Placement or international examinations taken in high school.
- Credit is awarded for College Level Examination Program (CLEP) specific scores and subjects.

- Testing out of certain courses through Cincinnati State's 'test out' procedures.
- Applying credit from applicable work experience, formal training programs, or other certificates or licenses.
- Applying credit earned through local College Tech Prep agreements or a referral from a senior vocational teacher.

Advanced Standing Credit is program-specific and fees may apply.

It All Starts with Affordable Tuition and Continues with Financial Aid

To help make an education at Cincinnati State even more affordable, our Office of Financial Aid works closely with current and prospective students to help them learn about and apply for available scholarships, loans, grants, and work-study programs.

Scholarships

Scholarships are financial awards that do not require repayment. Awards can be based on need, academic achievement, or other criteria that reflect the values of the donor. Scholarships are available from Cincinnati State as well as outside programs. The annual deadline to apply for Cincinnati State scholarships is February 15.

Financial Aid

At the same time students apply to Cincinnati State, they may also apply for financial aid. In order to be eligible to receive financial aid, students must first submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form, available online at www.studentaid.gov. Use Cincinnati State's Title IV Code (010345) when filling out your FAFSA so that Cincinnati State's Financial Aid Office receives your information as well.

Federal Work Study

The Federal Work-Study Program provides parttime jobs on campus for students with proven financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay for educational expenses.

Grants

Grants are need-based financial aid awards offered by the college that do not have to be repaid. Students who accept grants are usually required to meet certain academic standards.

Loans

Loans must be paid back to the lender over a period of time. Loan programs are sponsored by federal or state bodies or by private lenders.
